Thus, it was foreseen that in the context of production of syllabuses, when the working group had finalised its work, the Inspector-Chair would send the syllabus to the Head of the Pedagogical Development Unit, who was a member of the Quality Assurance Working Group and who would handle the procedure's follow-up and ensure the syllabus's conformity with document 2011-09-D-47.

The JBI approved the proposals for amendment made in the document 'Procedure for the production, management and publication of the syllabuses of the European Schools' and sent it forward to the JTC and to the BoG for information.

III.F. OTHER ITEMS

1. **Transfer application for the post of Deputy Director for the secondary cycle at the European School, Luxembourg I – 2017-09-D-30-en-1 – A. BECKMANN**

The current Deputy Director for the secondary cycle of the European School, Alicante was applying for a transfer to the European School, Luxembourg I, where the post of Deputy Director for the secondary cycle would be vacant on 31 August 2018.

The JBI approved the transfer application for the post of Deputy Director for the secondary cycle at the European School, Luxembourg I and sent it forward to the BoG for information.
