

COMMUNIQUE FROM THE CENTRAL ENROLMENT AUTHORITY

CONCERNING THE STRUCTURE OF THE CLASSES OF THE EUROPEAN SCHOOL, BRUSSELS II – EVERE SITE

FOR THE 2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR

Following the making available by the Belgian State of the Evere temporary site for the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year in September 2021, the Board of Governors of the European Schools decided, on 20 October 2020, that this site would accommodate the nursery (N1-N2) and primary (P1-P5) classes of all the language section open at the European School, Brussels II – Woluwé Site, i.e. the German, English, Finnish, French, Italian, Lithuanian, Dutch, Portuguese and Swedish language sections (DE, EN, FI, FR, IT, LT, NL, PT and SV), provided that there was a sufficient number of pupils per class and without prejudice to the regrouping by year group rules.

At its meetings of 18 and 25 March 2021, the Central Enrolment Authority considered the enrolment and transfer applications submitted during the first enrolment phase (from 11 to 29 January 2021) for the 2021-2022 school year, with a view to determining the classes that could be opened on the Evere temporary site, in accordance with the provisions of the Policy on Enrolment in the Brussels European Schools for the 2021-2022 school year (2020-12-D-9-en-3).

In view of the fact that pupil numbers are too low in the Finnish, Lithuanian, Dutch, Portuguese and Swedish language sections and in certain year groups of the German, English, French and Italian language sections, the structure of the European School, Brussels II – Evere Site appearing in Annex II to the aforementioned Enrolment Policy has been updated, in accordance with Article 3.2. of the Policy.

In the light of the number of enrolment applications submitted, on 29 April 2021, the structure is as follows:
